





From the Secretary's Desk

Brethren, the new Lodge is completed. We are moved in and functioning. I personally am very pleased at what we have constructed, as we all should be. For those of you who have not been able to see it yet, please do so as soon and as often as you can, come and enjoy our new facility and the fellowship.

We have received many negative comments concerning the purchase of the new building, or rather that that is the cause of the raising of our dues. **NOT TRUE.** The Lodge has lost approximately \$ 10,000.00 per year for the past several years. Each of the past 3 years, we have budgeted less costs than the previous year. Last year, 2012, not only did we budget less cost than in 2011, but our actual costs were approximately \$ 2,200.00 less than budgeted. Yet the Lodge ended the year in the **RED** by approximately \$ 7,800.00----**WHY.**

We ended the year 2012 with 308 members. Only 235 of those paid their dues. Had the other 73 paid their dues, the Lodge would have had \$ 8,030.00 extra income and had a break even year. This year we have 318 members. To date 141 have paid their dues. The success **or failure** of the Lodge depends on it's members.


SHRINE WIDOWS & FRIENDS CLUB

Greetings from the West



I have long had a fascination with all things "Egyptian". Like Benjamin Franklin, my interest in Freemasonry was at least PARTLY inspired by the belief that Masonry may in fact be ONE of the 'vessels' through which some of the ancient traditions, rituals and wisdom of the Pyramid builders was transmitted to our day.

For **MANY** years respected Egyptologists were adamant, that while the Egyptians performed rituals (they considered beneficial) over the bodies of the deceased, there were NO such "initiations" given to the LIVING!!! Any talk of the Equptians transmitting "secret knowledge" or "WISDOM" by way of INITIATION, was dismissed out of hand as being 'mystical hokum'. Recent decades (however), have seen this situation reversed.

It is now widely recognized that many ancient Egyptians did **INDEED** participate in ritualistic "initiations" DURING THEIR LIFETIMES, in order to receive "secret" knowledge intended to benefit them in their **PRESENT**, as well as their **FUTURE** life, in the life world to come.

Even the famous and enigmatic "Book of the Dead", (long viewed as being ONLY a funerary document), is **NOW** admitted by mainstream Egyptologists to being a "book of the living for conducting **initiations** here on earth". It (and its cousin, the "Book of Breathings"), is NOW sometimes viewed as a sort of 'script' or 'prompt sheet', for getting one through the long and often complex rituals used during initiation. In fact, it may not be too much of a "stretch", to compare them to our modern Masonic "Ciphers".

Indeed, a careful study of ancient Egyptian rituals, show MANY significant points of resemblance with modern Freemasonry; and while it would be incorrect to suggest that Egyptian and Masonic rituals were of a kind, it would NOT be wildly off the mark to suggest that the similarities are more than superficial. If an ancient Egyptian could be "magically" transported in time, to participate in the Degrees of Masonry, he would find **MUCH** that he recognized and was familiar with. It might even be that he would understand its 'esoteric' meanings more readily than his modern counterpart; for he was steeped in this very type of symbolism, from his youth and upward.

Brethren – When our ritual refers to Masonry as being "Ancient and Honorable", it is NO EXAGERATION! Freemasonry DOES carry (for those who are inclined to search), some of the "Secrets" of the "Ancients", and a far deeper meaning than we commonly ascribe to it. In some of my upcoming TRESTLEBOARD articles, I hope to explore some of these themes more fully.

In the meantime, I'd like to encourage the Brethren to **CONSIDER** the organization of Masonic study groups, where papers can be presented, and where Lectures (accompanied by Dinner) might also be delivered; so that those things which are not proper to be put to paper, MAY (nonetheless), be transmitted "mouth to ear" and lodged within the Faithful Breast. We now have the facilities at our disposal for doing so. May we make such good and noble use of them, is my humble suggestion and wish.
