

One of the most remarkable books in my personal Library is Albert Pike's "Morals and Dogma". For many years, it was customary for every Mason (upon his reception of the 32nd Degree of Scottish Rite Masonry) to be given his own personal copy, to read and study at his leisure. This custom (however), has become largely obsolete for two reasons:

1. The expense of printing and binding the Volume, became prohibitive; and

2. So few people ever took the time to read it.

It's a tragedy (really), that one of the greatest and most comprehensive modern works on ancient religion, philosophy, symbolism and esoterica – a book that endeavors to establish positive connections between the ancient Prophets, Sages, Magi, Scriptures, "Mystery Religions" AND modern "Freemasonry" - should set (largely unread), in Masonic Libraries and homes across America.

Why is this 'masterpiece' in Masonic Literature so little read??

Well, for one thing, **it's** *LONG* – 861 pages of deep and often mindbending prose. Like the "*Bible*", Homer's "*Iliad*", or Shakespeare's "*Hamlet*", it's not something MOST people pick-up for a "bit of light reading". To gain understanding, you may have to THINK about every sentence - sometimes about every word! And when you're finished (*IF* you finish), you MAY find yourself highly educated on a topic that makes your "dinner conversations" a little less than 'sparkling' (to MOST folks)!

So why bother??

Well, it turns out that there **REALLY ARE** people today who **DO** still enjoy reading the "*Bible*", Homer and Shakespeare!!! The continued popularity of books and movies such as "*The Da Vinci Code*"; and books, articles and interviews by (or about) modern Scholars **Joseph Campbell** and **Hugh Nibley**, demonstrates strong (if silent) testimony to the fact that THOUSANDS of us see "connections" everywhere – the very connections that Albert Pike saw when he penned "*Morals and Dogma*"!

If you love learning - if you love esoterica, mysteries, ancient religions **AND** Freemasonry - find (if you can) a copy of "*Morals and Dogma*" and let the fun begin!!
