

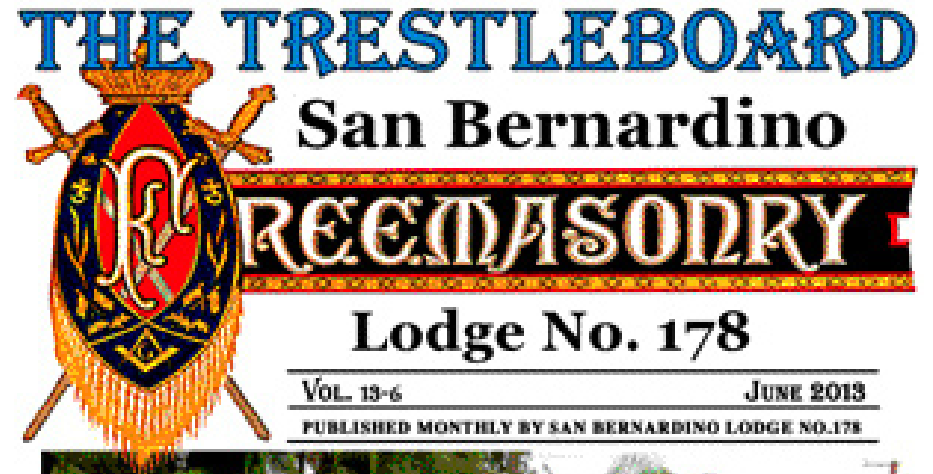

Greetings from the West

When I was a kid, there was a great song popularized by **Brother Nat King Cole**, titled **"Those Lazy, Hazy, Crazy Days of Summer"**; and well, those days are here at last! Officially, summer begins this month on June 21st, at the "Summer Solstice" or longest day of the year. **Unofficially, (here in California at least)**, we often feel that summer started sometime in May - hence the long **"roll out"** of **"those lazy, hazy, crazy days"**.

For Freemasons however, summer and the Summer Solstice carry a more important symbolic meaning: for **it is on June 24th that we traditionally honor John the Baptist** (the first of the "two holy Saints John" to whom all Lodges are dedicated).

The Baptist typically wore a **"camel's hair" garment** - probably not the rough and uncomfortable article of clothing we imagine, for it is recorded in the ancient "Apollonius paradoxographus" that camel's hair was used to make a **luxurious garment**; whereas the poor would (instead) be typically clothed in garments made of goat's hair.

Over this distinctive garment, John the Baptist also wore a leathern **"girdle" or apron** - which (other than its purely utilitarian function of protecting the loins of laborers) **was the distinctive dress of Priests and Kings, representing their priesthood and power**. Thus, even in his clothing, the Baptist silently declared himself the peer of not only King Herod, but also of the Sadducee elite of the Jerusalem Temple, and thus qualified in every way to criticize the unlawful marriage of King Herod to the wife of his own brother Phillip! Finally (never backing down from his criticism of the King's public immorality), he was beheaded at the instigation of the Kings **illegitimate wife!**

Brethren.....like John the Baptist, each of us have been invested with a "leathern" apron, which likewise emblematically makes us the peer of "King, Prince, Potentate, or any other person" - we need fear NO MAN if our cause is just! At this time of soda, pretzels, beer and beaches, may we take the time (whatever our religious persuasion) to honor the memory of John the Baptist, one of the Patron Saints of Masonry, and a true example of Masonic integrity!! May we mark our calendars as a reminder, and personally do something to set the day apart as being somehow **uniquely dedicated to our ancient Brother John, even if it is only to raise a toast to him!**

Finally, never forget, that in the pursuit of our Masonic ideals, we (like John - and like up to 200,000 Masons during the Nazi Regime of Germany) may be called on to give our last full measure in the cause of Truth.
