November 14th will be a practice, and we will have our coffee social on November 16th at 9:00am.



Greetings from the West

The building of Solomon's Temple, the persons who accomplished it, AND the circumstances surrounding its successful completion, have inspired several chapters of "Scripture" in the Bible, spawned many interesting associated legends worldwide, AND is central to the ritual and storyline of modern "Freemasonry".

On the other hand, finding the historical "Truth" behind it all, has been frustratingly difficult for both layman AND Scholar. Sources are often confusing and inconsistent; and even the Biblical versions (in spite of their so-called "inerrancy") are suspiciously inconsistent in key details - leading some to wonder if the obfuscation is not (in fact) intentional.

For example: In 1 Kings 7:14, Hiram (the widows son) is specifically said to be "of the tribe of Naphtali", (which was one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Yet, the very same Bible, in 2 Chronicles 2:14 states that (rather than being of the tribe of Naphtali), his mother (therefore presumably Hiram himself), was "a woman of the daughters of Dan" (a tribe entirely DIFFERENT from Naphtali)!!

Another example has to do with the marvelous Brass Pillars, Jachin and Boaz: 1 Kings 7:15 explicitly states that these pillars were "eighteen cubits high apiece"; while 2 Chronicles 3:15 just as positively states that the two pillars were "thirty and five cubits high", a whopping difference of 17 cubits (or ABOUT 25 and a half feet) each.

Again, the capitals or "chapiters" of the two Pillars were adorned with rows of "pomegranates" – 200 pomegranates on each chapiter according to 1 Kings 7:20; while 2 Chronicles 3:16 states that there were only "an hundred pomegratates"; and does not tell us if that was 100 per Pillar, or 100 altogether.

There are other significant differences in each account, which I do not have space here to relate; but one VERY interesting and significant particular relative to the dimensions of the Temple, have to do with its "Porch": Most artistic renderings of King Solomon's Temple put the Porch of the Temple at 30 cubits (about 45 feet), which was the height of the Temple building itself. What is generally omitted, (although it has the testimony of the book of 2 Chronicles 3:4 AND of the great Jewish Historian Josephus, himself), is that the Porch's "height was an hundred and twenty" cubits or an astounding 180 feet! To put it into a "modern" perspective, the Porch apparently towered 20 stories high, dwarfing the rest of the Temple with its spectacular proportions!! This significant detail of the building is generally 'left out' of most pictures and models, (partly) because modern architects have difficulty understanding how it could have been erected to such heights with the building materials of the day; and (partly) because the disproportionate dimensions are jarring to our "modern" architectural notions of proportion and beauty. Yet, despite any misgivings 21st Century readers may entertain, it is (nonetheless) testified to as having been so by the Bible AND by Josephus!
