



Greetings from the West



Recently, a dear friend of mine went on an antiquing adventure and came across a lapel pin of a honey bee with the Masonic square and compass on its right wing. Knowing that I am a Mason, she purchased it and gave it to me as a gift, which, of course, I appreciated very much. Well, being that I am a student of symbolism and am constantly amazed at the rich meanings of the symbols of our craft, I immediately went on a WebQuest to find out everything I could about the metaphor and symbolism of the bee and bee hive.

The bee in all ages has been thought of as a symbol of industrious living, where the function is for the good of the hive and not the individual. Each bee is given one stinger that can be used for defense of the hive at the cost of the life of the bee. The bee is in a sense the epitome of hard work and selfless sacrifice. I have included the following definitions below from various Masonic commentaries:

"The Bee Hive is an emblem of industry, and recommends the practice of that virtue to all created beings, from the highest seraph in heaven to the lowest reptile in the dust. It teaches us that we come into the world rational and intelligent beings, so we should ever be industrious ones; never sitting down content while our fellow creatures around us are in want, especially when it is in our power to relieve them without inconvenience to ourselves.

When we take a survey of nature, we view man in his infancy, more helpless and indigent that the brute creation. He lies languishing for day, months, and years, totally incapable of providing sustenance for himself, or quarding against the attack of wild beasts of the fields, or sheltering himself from the inclemency's of the weather. It might have pleased the great Creator of heaven and earth to have made man independent of all other beings, but as dependence is one of the strongest bonds of society, mankind were made dependent on each other for protection and security, as they thereby enjoy better opportunities of fulfilling the duties of reciprocal love and friendship. Thus was man formed for social and active life, the noblest part of the work of God, and he that will so demean himself as not to be endeavoring to add to the common stock of knowledge and understanding, may be deemed a drone in the hive of nature, a useless member of society, and unworthy of our protection as Masons." He works in complete cooperation, and without dissention, with his fellow bees. He protects the Queen, refuses admittance to enemies, builds, makes honey, and lives in a society ruled by law. What bees do can be compared with the cathedral builders of centuries ago. ... Undoubtedly, the operative masons saw their duplicate in the bees." (The Craft and Its Symbols, A.E. Roberts, p. 74)
