



The square of 3 is 9.

The square of 4 is 16. The sum of 9 and 16 is 25. (25 represents the hypotenuse).

The square root of 25 is 5.

Therefore, the ratio is written: 3:4:5:

When we write down the square of the 1st four numbers (1, 4, 9 and 16), we see that by subtracting each square from the next one, we get 3, 5 and 7.

Ok, let's try it.

1, 4, 9, 16

4-1 =3

9-4 = 5

16-9 = 7

3:5:7: These are the steps in Masonry. They are the steps in the Winding Stair which leads to the Middle Chamber and they are the number of brethren which form the number of Master Masons necessary to open a lodge of:

Master Mason: 3

Fellow Craft: 5

Entered Apprentice: 7

These are the sacred numbers.

The 47th Problem of Euclid, also called the 47th Proposition of Euclid, or the Pythagorean Theorem, is represented by what appear to be 3 squares.



To the speculative Mason, the 47th Problem of Euclid may be somewhat mysterious. They may see this symbol on Masonic certificates, on cuff links, or quite often Freemasons proudly wear lapel pins with this symbol on them.

The Pythagorean Theorem, also known as the 47th Problem of Euclid or 3:4:5:

"In any right triangle, the sum of the squares of the two sides is equal to the square of the hypotenuse." (the hypotenuse of a right triangle...which is the longest "leg"...or the 5 side of the 3:4:5:).

The Right Triangle, below, shows the sides of 3, 4 and 5. The angle created between the 3 (side) and the 4 (side) is the Right angle of the square.

A little later, when we begin to build it, (with sticks and string), you will place your sticks at the 3 corners of this Right triangle.


#### **SHRINE WIDOWS & FRIENDS CLUB**

#### Greetings from the South



While Freemasonry is decidedly NOT a religion, AND in fact gives no preference or favor (as an institution) to one religion over another, we have (nonetheless), symbolically dedicated our Lodges to two notable "Christian Saints", often refered to as "the Holy Saints John": John the Baptist, AND John the Evangelist.

Each year (during the month of June), the birth and life of Saint John the Baptist is commemorated (by festival), on the 24th of June. One Masonic source attributes our reverence for the Baptist to his "firm integrity....which induced him to forgo every minor consideration in discharging the obligations he owed to God" and to "the unselfish firmness with which me met martyrdom rather than betray his duty to his Master".

Albert Pike suggested that the Baptist's connection to Masonry may be more substantial; by alluding to the legend of Templar founder Hugo de Payens' alleged connections to "Theocletes", the leader of a "Johannite" sect in the Jerusalem of their day. According to the story, Hugo de Payens was converted to the doctrines of Theocletes, and merged the two institutions, which in turn became the forerunner of Freemasonry!

The legend has never been substantiated; it IS nevertheless true, that ANOTHER Johannite Sect, known as the Mandaeans, has survived (in small numbers) into the 21st Century, in the nation of Iraq. The religion is notable, in that it places a high priority and precedence on John the Baptist as an early leader of their Sect. Their claim to have migrated (in ancient times) from the area of Palestine, to their current locations in the Middle East is taken seriously by many scholars. Be that as it may, it is ALSO true that there is a significant similarity in their secret work, to OUR secret work, that deserves serious inquirey and research.

Why do we honor Saint John the Baptist? Is there truly a "Masonic Secret" concerning this matter to reward the diligent seeker? Brethren, these things are worth studying and pondering this month!!

Our meal at the Stated Meeting during the month of June, will be prepared by our excellent "Chef" Threasa Kruiger-Harlan, and served by the young ladies of the Job's Daughters!! Please come, bring a guest and enjoy the food and fellowship.
