




## Greetings from the West



As we enter this season of Christmas, I was reminded, as I was pulling out the Christmas tree out of storage, of the similarities between that and the acacia tree, which is a beloved symbol of our craft. We are taught through our Masonic Education that the acacia tree is an emblem of immortality. The acacia is a symbol for that part of man that shall remain even after our bodies have returned to dust.

It is a hard wood, evergreen tree that can be found in various forms and varieties around the globe. We learn from Mackey's Encyclopedia that "The acacia is called in the Bible Shittim... It was esteemed a sacred wood among the Hebrews, and of it Moses was ordered to make the tabernacle, the Ark of the Covenant, the table for the shewbread, and the rest of the sacred furniture (Exodus 25-27)." It is a hardy plant that can thrive in arid conditions and produces Gum Arabic as a sap that is used in a variety of applications as described below:

"It remains an important ingredient in <u>soft drink syrups</u>, "hard" gummy candies such as <u>gumdrops</u>, <u>marshmallows</u>, <u>M&M's</u> chocolate candies and edible glitter, modern cakedecorating staple. Traditional <u>binder</u> used in <u>watercolor paint</u>, in photography for <u>gum printing</u>, and it is used as a binder in <u>pyrotechnic</u> compositions. It has been investigated for use in pharmaceuticals and <u>cosmetics</u> also use the gum as a <u>binder</u>, emulsifying agent and a suspending or viscosity increasing agent. As a <u>wine fining agent</u>. It is an important ingredient in <u>shoe polish</u>, and can be used in making homemade incense cones. It is also used as a lickable <u>adhesive</u>, for example on <u>postage stamps</u> and <u>cigarette papers</u>. Lithographic printers employ it to keep the non-image areas of the plate receptive to water. This treatment also helps to stop oxidation of aluminum printing plates in the interval between processing of the plate and its use on a printing press." (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Gum arabic)
