

I have been asked to try and put some pictures such as the one we had in not too long ago of a first degree. The Printers say that if we have any kind of documentation to provide. They will try their best to put it in the trestleboard. Also, we have another source on the internet that I believe was set up by Wor. Brannon which is dedicated to Masonry. It is a posting board and allows the members to keep in touch on the Internet as well. It is under the title of IEFreemason@yahoo. com. Listed here is the first part of how to restore membership. This may be a little out of date, but it should not be that far off. Here is what I have for one part of it. Many members of a Masonic Lodge who allow their dues to lapse and thereby incur suspension by there lodge, do not realize that they are privileged to apply for restoration to membership and when restored become once again a part of the Masonic family. This article is rewritten from a pamphlet that will help to restore membership in

a Masonic Lodge. These are the steps, which a person should take. Restoration before two years. If your suspension for nonpayment of dues occurred Less than two years ago all you need to do is to pay your lodge dues which you owed at the time of your suspension plus those dues which have accumulated from the time of your suspension until the present date. An example, suppose you did not pay your dues in 2007. At the time of the stated meeting in June of 2008, the Master declares you suspended for nonpayment from the rights and privileges of Masonry. Now in 2009 you wish to be

restored. Your
