






May 7th – 5:30 pm – Executive Board Meeting May 15th – 5:30 pm – Stated Meeting 5:30 pm – Women's Association meeting 6:30 pm – Imperial Potentate's Visitation with El Bekal & Al Malaikan Shrines Actually, it was not Pythagoras who directly discovered the rule, as the Egyptians used the same principle for a very long time before Pythagoras, whereby they re-measured their fields after the annual flooding of the Nile washed out their boundary markers, and also in the construction of the Great Pyramids. Hence, Pythagoras is properly referred to as being the one who <u>proved</u> that the process works.


We now know all of the measurements used by the ancient Egyptians, those being 500, 480, 400, 320, 180, 144 and 108. Why is this important? If we interpret each unit to be a cubit (an ancient form of measurement), then 500 is the base of the Great Pyramid of Memphis. 400 cubits is the length of an Egyptian stadium (stadium is plural for stadia, and ancient measurement unit, based on a particular number of steps, also called a Khet by the Egyptians). 480 cubits is the length of the Ptolemy stadium, 320 cubits is the length of the Hebrew and Babylonian stadium. Furthermore, 180, which represents the smaller part of the hypotenuse, doubled gives 360 cubits, the Cleomedes stadium. By doubling 144 cubits gives 288 cubits, the Archimedes stadium. Finally by doubling 108 cubits we obtain 216 cubits, or the lesser Egyptian stadium. In other words, the formula formed the basis of all the lengths used by the Egyptians, and hence also once again indicates that its principle was well understood by the Egyptians, and hence taught by them to Pythagoras.

History records that Pythagoras established a society with philosophical, religious, and political aims. Shrouded in secrecy, they believed that only by truly understanding the universe could one achieve salvation of the soul, and as Divinity created all things, studying it over a period of several lifetimes could bring one closer to Divinity itself. As such, it was believed that through study and reason could one start to understand Divinity. Clearly, reason is based on measurable things (such as through numbers and objects), and is easier to understand if expressed in that matter by a larger number of people. Hence the society devoted much of its time to mathematics, including Geometry, to try to explain and express matters using numbers. Being able to explain many unknowns using reason (and numbers) was incorporated in Freemasonry.

Masonic Education: - The 47th Problem of Euclid



- There are a total of 465 problems published by Euclid
- Euclid wrote a total of 13 books, which were called "Elements"
- Each book contained many propositions or explanations of geometry
- The 47th problem is found in Book 1 and is also known as the Pythagorean Theorem
- Pythagoras was a philosopher who had a keen understanding of geometry
- $A \leq + B \leq = C \leq$
- Builders since ancient time have called this "squaring a room."
- The 47th problem of Euclid allows Astronomers to measure the distance to the sun, Engineers to tunnel through two sides of a mountain and meet in the middle, Sailors to track their journey through the open sea.
