

Brethren, on April 22, 2007, I was saddened to receive the news that Wor. Bill Hawks had passed away on Saturday, April 21<sup>st</sup>. He was an active member of the lodge for over half a century and always brought cheer and good fellowship. Wor. Hawks was Master of Rialto lodge in 1953, was a member of the San Bernardino Scottish Rite, was active in High Twelve, and many more Masonic activities. He participated in hundreds of third degrees over the years, particularly in the second section in the Oriental Chair. Wor. Hawks was also masterful in the delivery of the Masonic funeral service, which I had the privilege of observing while I participated as the Chaplain. He was an exemplary Mason, and the sands of time have claimed one of the lodge's trusty ancient pillars.

I contacted the Scottish Rite as requested by the lodge, and several unexpected technicalities have come up that would suggest that our lodge will NOT be able to obtain a long-term lease any time in the near future (certainly not this year). Brethren:



### **Masonic Education: The Holy Saints John**

Freemasons and those that belong to organizations like the Knights Templar are dedicated to St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist. On this day, June 24<sup>th</sup>, there are many Freemasons from around the world who are attending their churches in celebration of St. John the Baptist. On December 27<sup>th</sup>, Freemasons memorialize St. John the Evangelist. Both of these dates coincide with the Summer and Winter Solstices, respectively.

St. John the Baptist has been the patron of Freemasonry since the very earliest writings of the craft. He was also the patron of many other organizations like the Knights Templar that had early effects on the formation of Masonic thought. St. John the Evangelist was selected as a patron saint of the craft at a later period, not earlier that the 16<sup>th</sup> century; slightly before the organization of modern Masonry as we know it.

The personal attributes and teaching of the Saints John exemplify Masonic teaching and practice. St. John, the Baptist, is well know for his personal integrity which induced him, under the most adverse circumstances, to adhere to the obligations he felt he owed to God and to his fellowman. While continually reproving vice, even to the king, he also preached of repentance and the need for a virtuous life (read Luke 3: 2-14). His adherence to his convictions cost him his life.

St. John the Evangelist continually admonished his followers and readers to the cultivation of brotherly love. The entire thread of his Gospel and Epistles is that of the need for brotherly love. He, over all other Saints and Disciples, was allowed to witness many mystical visions. Possibly he was permitted this additional light because his spirit was in a condition to understand and utilize the light for the betterment of his fellow men. This he endeavored to do. The First Epistle of John is Masonic teaching in its purest form. While the need for brotherly love has existed since before the time of Cain and Abel, nowhere in the Bible is the formula given so clearly for this requirement than in the teachings of Jesus as detailed by St. John the Evangelist.

With the foregoing in mind, it is very easy to understand why these two Saints were chosen to exemplify Masonic teaching and practices. "History does not tell us why the Saints John were selected as the patron saints of Freemasonry. Whatever the facts may be, surely it is in accordance with the fitness of things that we honor these two names, John the Baptist, the stern prophet of righteousness, and John the Evangelist, the teacher of love. Righteousness and love – those two words do not fall short of telling the whole duty of a man and a Mason" – Joseph Fort Newton.
