



Dear Brothers

We have reached the final few brothers who have not paid their 2007 dues yet and we need to get that done here A.S.A.P., most seem to just have forgotten due to whatever circumstances. If you are reading this and have not paid, now is the time. Part of what we have to do is consider raising our dues. In part, because we will be paying more in per capita this year. The cost per brother, is about \$30. That is half of what we get, that leaves us with \$30 to operate. If you multiply that by the number of members we then have about \$12,000 to run the lodge. Rent, the trestleboard, the Secretary, and postage-these things are about the amount that we have just to operate, which leaves nothing to do any kind of activity. Now some are going to flinch, because we seem to ask more money and don't have much to give back in return. Those who have financial hardship and are not active in the Lodge can ask for a remit, where the Lodge carries your membership, but without having to pay per capita. The other method is to demit, the brother withdraws his membership, in good standing. At some point if he wants to return he can petition the Lodge to be reinstated without having been suspended. The lodge has some really good members working to make sure the Lodge progresses, but it is the few that are making a lot happen. I thank each of those active brothers for making our Lodge easier to manage. We have some 9 members waiting to be initiated, passed or raised and the more members we get the better off we will be financially. Everyone who joins is paying fees which then go to the Lodge. If we had 30 or 40 new members or more we could have some really dynamic activities, so that we can keep these new brothers actively pursuing some avenue in the Lodge. The Lodge is doing well as far as the assets we have from before and at this point we are looking around to see if there are some available properties, but we have the time to make an intelligent move. The Lodge should consider that we need some alternative sources of income. The good things of owning property is that you have a semi-reliable incomes, the bad part is that you have to be able to manage them if you have rentals. Should the Lodge consider having a stock portfolio, in Electric or Gas or Utilities, these are other things which we don't require the constant foot work of having property. The Lodge is doing well right now, and if we continue to act in a prudent manner with our assets we should end the year with a positive balance, but we have to start the process of having a more fixed situation with a lodge room and getting some good family oriented activities, pot lucks and stuff. THE TEMPLE

Masonic Education: The Square

The Holy Bible lies open upon the Altar of Masonry, and upon the Bible lie the Square and Compass. They are the three Great Lights of the Lodge, at once its Divine warrant and its chief working tools. They are symbols of Revelation, Righteousness, and Redemption, teaching us that by walking in the light of Truth and obeying the law of Right, the Divine in man wins victory over the earthly. How to live is the one important matter, and he will seek far without finding a wiser way than that shown us by the Great Lights of the Lodge.

The Square and Compasses are the oldest, the simplest, and the most universal symbols of Masonry. All the world over, whether as a sign on a building, or a badge worn by a Brother, even the profane know them to be emblems of our ancient Craft. Some years ago, when a business firm tried to adopt the Square and Compass as a trademark, the U.S. Patent Office refused permission, on the ground, as the decision said, that "there can be no doubt that this device, so commonly worn and employed by Masons, has an established mystic significance, universally recognized as existing; whether comprehended by all or not, is not material to this issue." They belong to such, alike by the associations of history and the tongue of common report.

Nearly everywhere in our Ritual, as in the public mind, the Square and Compass are seen together. If not interlocked, they are seldom far apart, and the one suggests the other. And that is as it should be, because the things they symbolize are interwoven. In the old days when the earth was thought to be flat and square, the Square was an emblem of the earth, and later, of the earthly element om. As the sky is an arc or a circle, the implement which describes a Circle became the symbol of the heavenly, or sky spirit in man. Thus the tools of the builder became the emblems of the thoughts of the thinker; and nothing in Masonry is more impressive than the slow elevation of the Compasses above the Square in the progress of the degrees. The whole meaning and task of life is there, for such as have eyes to see. The temple made of wood and stone may crumble and decay, But there's a viewless fabric which shall never fade away,

Age after age each Mason strives to carry out his plan, But still the work's unfinished which those ancient Three began.

None but immortal eyes may view complete in all it's parts, The Temple formed of Living Stones-the structure made of hearts.
