



FROM THE EAST

Brethren, the Grand Lodge Annual Communication in San Francisco went well and the lodge cast our ballots. The lodge was represented by the Master on behalf of the 3 principal officers, as well as L. Michael Betschart, P.M., balloting for the Past Masters. The results of the voting in the Annual Communication are summarized on the Grand Lodge's website and are also available in writing from the Master.

At the Stated Meeting in October, the membership voted unanimously to approve the motion to re-structure our annual dues, so that the Per Capita fee is separate from our lodge's operating budget. The membership present voted to approve your lodge's annual dues in the amount of \$70. The Per Capita fee will be a separate fee in addition to that \$70. The membership also voted unanimously to approve the motion to change our by-laws reflecting the new location at the York Rite Temple. Thank you to all who participated in these important issues.

At this month's Stated Meeting we will conduct our annual election of officers. While there are prospects for most of the officer chairs, we always need officers "on call" to fill in on short-term notice for degrees. Of course, sideliners are always welcome even if not participating in the conferral of degrees. I invite all interested Master Masons to contact me for more information. Note that the practice for the installation will be held on the last Thursday of this month. The actual Installation of Officers is being planned for Thursday, December 13th, at 7:00 p.m.

As for the housekeeping activities, we continue to filter through the items in storage at the Scottish Rite facility. We welcome any assistance that can be offered from the brethren, in terms of looking through old photos and such, in order to preserve our history for future generations. At some time in the distant future, our membership may wish to purchase a new lodge facility elsewhere and we want to do our part today so that it can be furnished appropriately and with our history intact.

Masonic Education: "So Mote It Be"

Why do we use "So Mote It Be" instead of the contemporary Amen? "So Mote It Be" are the final words in the Regius Poem. "Mote" is old English for "may." Masons have used the phrase since the beginning of time. Freemasonry includes many other words now obsolete, but the words bring the sanctity of age and the continuity of ritual from ancient days into modern times

The Regius Poem is the first known Masonic text. The general consensus on the age of the document dates its writing to between the late 14th Century to mid 15th Century. It consists of 64 written pages in poetic form. The manuscript came into the possession of the Royal Library prior to the 18th Centruy, and King George II then donated the manuscript to the Library of the British Museum in 1757. It is now held by the British Library in the Royal Manuscript Collection.

The poem begins by evoking Euclid and his invention of geometry in ancient Egypt and then the spreading of the art of geometry in "divers lands." This is followed by 15 points for the Master concerning both moral behavior (e.g. do not harbor thieves, do not take bribes, attend church regularly, etc.) and the operation of the work on a building site (do not make masons labor at night, teach apprentices properly, do not accept jobs you cannot do, etc.). There are then 15 points for craftsmen which follow a similar pattern. The text of the document also states that Freemasonry was brought to England during the reign of King Athelstan from 924 to 939 A.D. So Mote It Be!
