

#### New Lodge:


Brethren, on Thursday, January 26th, there was a meeting to discuss the new lodge. There was a brief history of how we came to be meeting at the Scottish Rite. An explanation of places that we have looked at and the approximate cost were then presented. The places that we have looked at start at\$600,000 dollars and go up. Many of them would need work. Also, the cost to build a building without land will be between \$472,000 and \$730,000 dollars. With the lodge having approximately \$680,000 dollars from the sale of the building at 4th and Arrowhead and seeing that we will need to have somewhere around a million dollars to get a new building, a discussion about a build-out of a back room in the Scottish Rite for a Lodge Room then followed with an approximate cost of building-out the room at \$85,000 to \$100,000dollllars. The group in attendance included many members of the lodge and a representative from the bodies that rented from the Lodge while at 4th and Arrowhead. The groups agreed that the plan that made the most sense was to approach the Scottish Rite for the use of the back room. This was presented to the Lodge at the Stated Meeting on the 2nd of February. And, the Lodge agreed that the Building Board should enter into negotiations with the Scottish Rite in regards to the back room. When the Building Board has finished their negotiations a final report will be made to the lodge and a final vote will be taken. If you have any suggestions or comments, please feel free to discuss them with the elected officers of the lodge. All we want is a place that we can afford to buy and afford to maintain.

Many Masons know that Rudyard Kipling, the great English poet and author, was a Brother. However, most only know of Masonic references in two of his works: the short story 'The Man Who Would Be King' and the poem 'Mother Lodge'. But reading Kipling carefully, one will find references to the Craft scattered through his works. Sometimes, they are readily apparent, while at other times they are obscure. Nevertheless, they are there.

Kipling was more open about his love of Freemasonry in his poetry. A prime example is "The Palace" (1902) which reads: When I was a King and a Mason.... a Master proven and skilled, I cleared me ground for a Palace such as a King would build. I decreed and dug down to my levels. Presently under the silt, I came on the wreck of a Palace such as a King had built. There was no worth in the fashion....there was no wit in the plan....Hither and thither, aimless, the ruined footings ran...Masonry, brute, mishandled, but carven on every stone: 'After me cometh a Builder. Tell him, 'I too have known'....When I was a King and a Mason...in the open noon of my pride, They sent me a Word from the Darkness. They whisperred and called me aside. They said....'The end is forbidden." They said..'Thy use is fulfilled. Thy Palace shall stand as that other's...the spoil of a King who shall build.'
